## **Notice under National Electricity Law**

The Australian Energy Market Commission (AEMC) gives notice under the National Electricity Law of the following matters.

Under section 99, the making of a draft determination and draft National Electricity Amendment (Scale Efficient Network Extensions) Rule 2011 (Project Ref. ERC0100). In relation to the draft determination:

- requests for a pre-determination hearing must be received by 17 March 2011;
- submissions must be received by 5 May 2011; and
- requests for a hearing should be forwarded to <a href="mailto:submissions@aemc.gov.au">submissions@aemc.gov.au</a> and must cite the Project Ref. in its title.

Under section 95, AEMO has requested the Business Day Definition Rule proposal (Project Ref. ERC0122). The proposal seeks to clarify the days that are recognised as public holidays and thereby make clear which days are business days under the Rules. The AEMC intends to expedite the Rule proposal under section 96 on the grounds that it considers the proposed Rule is non-controversial, subject to the receipt of written objections.

- written objections must be received by 25 March 2011;
- submissions must be received by 8 April 2011; and
