CONTEXT FOR REVIEW INTO TFP

- Expert Panel on Energy Access Pricing
- NGL and 2007 amendments to NEL allow for Rules permitting TFP methodology
- 23 June 2008 Victorian Minister's Rule Change Proposal
- 21 November 2008 AEMC initiates TFP Review
- 12 December 2008 AEMC Framework and Issues Paper

PURPOSE OF THE REVIEW

 advise the MCE whether, at this stage of market development, any allowed application of a TFP would contribute to either the national electricity objective and/or national gas objective

• if so, what amendments to the Rules should be made to enable the use of a TFP approach and in what circumstances

KEY CONSIDERATIONS

- Potential benefits to users, service providers and regulators
- Regulatory cost and burden
- Future investment needs and challenges facing the industry
- Support for a TFP methodology

KEY ISSUES

 What are the disadvantages with the current applications of the building blocks approach? Could a TFP based methodology address those disadvantages, and how?

 What are the economic and regulatory issues where two parallel forms of price setting methodology are in operation?

 What are the required data collection arrangements necessary to support the application of a TFP methodology? Are these arrangements achievable and/or desirable?

- Stage 1 Draft Report published by June 09
- Draft Report Public Forum
- Stage 1 Final Report to MCE by August 09
- If Final Report finds that a TFP methodology would contribute to National Objectives, the AEMC will then prepare and consult on draft Rules (Stage 2 of Review)
