- Current market functions reasonably well, but is not without its issues.
- General agreement on vision and objectives for market development and support for reform
- Some concerns with specific AEMC recommendations
 - Expected benefits
 - Complexity
 - Time / cost of reform
- Alternative pathways for reform may achieve similar or greater benefits with reduced complexity, time and cost.

- Independent strategic advice prepared on behalf of Victorian gas market participants
 - Qualitatively assess strengths / weaknesses of DWGM
 - Qualitatively assess strengths / weaknesses of AEMC proposal
 - Suggest pathway forward to progress reform
- Stakeholder consultation / involvement
 - Two workshops with participants
 - One on one consultations with participant
 - One on one consultations with other stakeholders
- Prepare brief report for participants to submit
 - Not striving for full consensus from all participants on every aspect of advice
 - Support for general thrust and intent of advice

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- Strengths / weaknesses qualitatively identified and assessed
 - major or moderate ranking
 - impacts on participants, consumers briefly described
- Matched against characteristics of well functioning gas market
 - Credible price
 - Timely / efficient investment
 - Availability of information
 - Ability to manage risks
 - Minimise barriers to entry
 - Minimise transaction costs
- Prepare 'heat map' style summary

Overarching observations

- Current market has some desirable features and issues
- Recognition that reform is needed status quo has issues and time is of the essence
- AEMC proposal has some desirable features and issues
- General agreement of shared vision as long term aspiration
- Recognition that market context and landscape is changing
- Requirement for continuous reform journey not destination



AEMC approach

- extensive change
- higher risk / uncertain outcome
- a number of years till change achieved
- Further develop / assess preferred model
 - Further analysis to develop preferred model
 - not recommended as just delays reform
 - significant work completed already
- Staged reform / hybrid approach
 - 'best of both worlds' strengths of current and AEMC
 - targeted and prioritised reform reduces risk and cost
 - commence implementation more readily
 - flexible to respond to changing circumstances as they arise
 - recognises continuous improvement

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
