Responding to the *Victorian jurisdictional derogation (smelter agreements)* rule change request

Lodging a request not to make a rule under an extradited process

Written requests not to make a rule under the extradited process in section 96 of the NEL must include reasons for the request, and must be lodged with the Commission by 13 March 2014, either online or by mail, in accordance with the requirements specified below.

Lodging a submission to this rule change request

Written submissions on the rule change request must be lodged with Commission by **27 March 2014**, either online or by mail, in accordance with the requirements specified below.

Where practicable, submissions should be prepared in accordance with the Commission's guidelines for making written submissions on rule change requests.¹ Please note that the Commission publishes all submissions on its website, subject to a claim of confidentiality.

Electronic Lodgement

Electronic submissions, or requests not to make a rule under the extradited process, must be lodged online via the Commission's website, www.aemc.gov.au, using the "lodge a submission" function and selecting the project reference code: **ERC0167**.

The request or submission must be on letterhead (if submitted on behalf of an organisation), signed and dated.
