



NER provisions?	Current architecture supports smart meters; Rules and procedures required for governance; to consider requirements for enforcing common protocol	Existing requirements for providing and maintaining metering communication interfaces
Transitional provisions?	To be developed especially to take into consideration arrangements in Victoria

New functions?	Majority of submissions supported new functions being introduced outside the 'common' market protocol	n/a [responsibility of the meter vendor and 'gate keeper']
Governance framework?	Support for AEMO or the Information Exchange Committee (IEC) to manage	n/a [responsibility of the meter vendor and 'gate keeper']

 - requirements for enforcing the protocol
